Our cozy set of 28 homes will be nestled in a meadow, within walking distance to the Willamette River and just a 15-minute ride down the bike path to Downtown Eugene. Architectural drawings will show you the building plans. Community members will show you what a what a great group of people we are! The City of Eugene and The Planning Commission have given us approvals, so we'll be breaking ground next spring.

Logistics

- Transportation is on your own; carpooling is encouraged.
- CoHo Ecovillage is at 1975 SE Crystal Lake Drive, on the corner of Crystal Lake Drive and Alexander in Corvallis. Park anywhere in our parking lot or on Alexander (but NOT on Crystal Lake Drive or the

- cemetery next door). The tour starts at the common house, the building with the tower at the parking lot entrance.
- For the Oakleigh Meadow Cohousing tour, meet at the offices of Willard Dixon at 300 Blair Blvd, Eugene, 97402. A talk will be followed by a tour of the land.
- Consult the internet if you'd like more detailed driving directions using either 15 or Highway 99. The two communities are about 43 miles/44 minutes apart.
